

Group Presentation and Paper

The purpose of this project is to give you and your partner(s) an opportunity to explore in detail an application or topic of voting theory of your choosing that we have not discussed in class.

The project will culminate with a short 2–3 page expository paper giving a general, non-technical introduction to your topic and a 20 minute in-class presentation during the last week of class. The purpose of the paper is to give the other students in the class some background about your topic before the presentation.

This is an opportunity not only for you to learn something new but also for you to teach your peers, and me, something as well. If you are having trouble deciding on a topic, I can give you some pointers for the types of projects that students have done in previous semesters.

Here are a few important dates:
